

Sign up in the counseling office (Mrs. Cermeno) by May 6th 3:00pm to take the ASVAB on May 7th at 9:00am. On May 21st at 9:00am the military will return to Castaic HS to give the results from the ASVAB to participating students.

ASVAB is offered for 10-12th grade students. Students can complete, no-cost career planning. Quick Facts:

-Validated Assessments: The ASVAB is an aptitude test that identifies skill strengths. The FYI is an interest inventory that highlights work-related interest areas. The results are used to guide career exploration.

-Post-Test Interpretation: This guided session provides an explanation of ASVAB scores and FYI results, followed by an opportunity to discover potentially satisfying career fields and all the ways to gain career field entry using the OCCU-Find.

-Career Planning Tools: Participants can make concrete career plans with these tangible outputs of their career exploration.

NAACP Santa Clarita Future Leaders Scholarship SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

The Future Leaders Scholarship is awarded by NAACP Santa Clarita to African American/Black

students residing in the Santa Clarita Valley who are pursuing higher education.

Scholarship amount: \$2,000 Number of awards: 5 The award is not renewable.

Criteria and Eligibility for the Future Leaders Scholarship:

O Must be a NAACP Santa Clarita member

- African American/Black resident of the Santa Clarita Valley A high school senior or undergraduate student of the 2024/2025 school year graduating class.
- Grade point average of 2.5 (C+) or above
- Provide an unofficial copy of high school or undergraduate transcripts.

A personal statement of no more than 250 words describing your plans for post secondary

education. Please include your full name, email and phone number.

Complete EITHER essay A or B in 500-1000 words

A) Why is voting in local, state, and federal elections important, even for young or first-time voters?

Discuss how policies at different levels of government directly impact communities and individuals,

and provide an example of how you would encourage your peers to participate in the electoral process.

B) Given the ongoing debates about Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) programs in America,

Do you believe these initiatives are still necessary and effective in addressing systemic inequities? How

has your personal experience as an African American student shaped your perspective on the role of

DEI programs in education and society today?

Students may apply to multiple NAACP scholarships but are not eligible to receive more than one

NAACP scholarship annually.

CRITERIA:

- APPLICANTS MUST HAVE ATTENDED SANTA CLARITA VALLEY SCHOOLS FOR AT LEAST SEVEN YEARS, INCLUDING AT LEAST ONE YEAR AT A PUBLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IN THE SANTA CLARITA VALLEY.
- APPLICANTS MUST HAVE ALREADY APPLIED FOR ADMITTANCE INTO A TRADE SCHOOL, COMMUNITY COLLEGE, AND/OR FOUR YEAR COLLEGE/UNIVERSITY.
- APPLICANTS MUST HAVE A CURRENT UNWEIGHTED GPA OF AT LEAST 2.5

PROCESS

- The application has two components
- · Online Application Form
- Essay written by the applicant: One page, single-spaced (typed; 12 pt. font)

ADDRESS THE FOLLOWING TOPIC:

Write an essay about a specific moment at a Santa Clarita Valley public school that changed you in a big way. In your story, clearly mention one teacher—whether from elementary, junior high, or high school—whose help or advice made a difference during that moment. Describe what happened, how it made you feel, and why it was so important to you. Use clear details and examples that show this was a real, personal experience that only you could tell.
